Subject: SFSU Responsibilities Under Section 504 and Title II; Complaint Policies and Procedures

San Francisco State University (SFSU) is committed to ensuring an inclusive, accessible, and equitable campus for all members of our community. This memo provides a summary of SFSU's obligations under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), as well as our policies for addressing disability discrimination, in accordance with California State University (CSU) Executive Orders.

1. SFSU Obligations Under Section 504 and Title II: Program and Physical Access

Under **Section 504** and **Title II**, SFSU is required to ensure that individuals with disabilities are provided equal access to **programs**, **services**, **activities**, **and physical spaces**, both academic and non-academic. It includes the following:

Program Accessibility

- All university programs, including academic courses, extracurricular activities, and public events, must be accessible to individuals with disabilities.
- This includes providing reasonable accommodations (e.g., sign language interpreters, notetaking services, exam modifications, accessible course materials).

Physical Accessibility

- University facilities must comply with ADA standards to ensure barrier-free access.
- New construction and major renovations must be fully accessible, while existing facilities must be modified where necessary to achieve program access.

Digital Accessibility

- o Online content, instructional materials, and university websites must meet accessibility standards
- WCAG 2.1

2. SFSU Discrimination Complaint Policies and Procedures

SFSU has developed procedures for responding to complaints of disability discrimination, as required under Section 504 and Title II. These procedures align with CSU system-wide policies, including:

Interim Nondiscrimination Policy (EO 1095)

• Executive Order 1111: Covers systemwide policies on disability support and accommodations.

Complaint Process Overview:

- Any student may appeal any reasonable accommodation decision made by Disability Programs and Resource Center by <u>filing an appeal</u> at any time. An appeals officer will review the appeal.
- Any employee or visitor may appeal any reasonable accommodation decision made by <u>Employee</u> <u>Accommodations</u>. An appeals officer will review the appeal.
- Any student, employee, or visitor who believes they have experienced discrimination or harassment
 based on disability may file a complaint with the Office for Civil Rights and Title IX.
- Confidentiality is maintained to the extent possible, and retaliation against individuals who report
 concerns is strictly prohibited.
